The Cash In The Plate For Today Goes To *The Episcopal Diocese of Hawaii - A Cup of Cold Water*

As many of you are aware, the island of Maui in Hawaii has been devastated by wildfires near the town of Lahaina. Hundreds of homes and businesses were destroyed, thousands were left homeless, and at least 100 have been killed in this tragedy.

The Episcopal Diocese of Hawaii is organizing direct assistance to those affected through A Cup of Cold Water, a Maui-based community outreach program supported by the four Episcopal churches on the island: Church of the Good Shepherd in Wailuku, St. John's Episcopal Church in Kula, Trinity Episcopal Church By-the-Sea in Kihei and Holy Innocents Episcopal.

Holy Innocents suffered a complete loss of their church buildings in the fire, and efforts continue to contact and locate all members of the community.

A Cup of Cold Water has been mobilized and assisting residents in obtaining food, water, and other necessities since immediately after the wildfires ravaged Lahaina. Further, ACCW is working with partners in the state to assist displaced persons with safe shelter. This beautiful community will, in time, bounce back, but our assistance will provide them with the help they need so desperately right now.

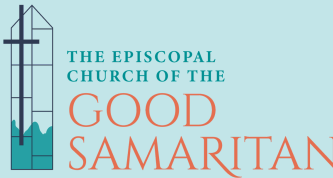
