It is assumed you will continue in that ministry even if you don't sign-up during the Ministry Fair. If, on the other hand, you wish to stop participating in that ministry, please contact the church office, or the contact person for that specific ministry.

## \*Acolytes

Good Samaritan Acolytes are youth and adults in grades three and up who participate in the sacramental ministry by serving as crucifers, torchbearers, and banner bearers. Newcomers are welcome. Acolytes serve approximately once every 4-6 weeks. *Training date TBD*.

#### \*Adult Choir

The Adult Choir sings at the 10:30 service on Sundays from August through May, and at other occasional programs and special liturgies, leading the congregation in song and offering music from diverse styles and traditions. Rehearsals are Wednesdays at 7:00pm.

#### \*Altar Guild & Linen Guild

Altar Guild members work in teams to prepare the church for all worship services, including baptisms, funerals, and weddings. Team members are given duties to either (1) arrange the church and altar for Sunday services; (2) clean and set out Eucharistic vessels between the two Sunday services; or (3) remove and clean items following the late Sunday service. Special tasks may also be assigned. Team members usually serve once every 4-5 weeks. All are welcome to come and share in this essential and rewarding ministry. Training and instructional materials will be available.

Linen Guild members clean and press the linens that are used during the Eucharistic services. A quarterly schedule is prepared and distributed, with individual assignments

for linen duties occurring once every 4-6 weeks. Linens can be picked up after Sunday's late worship service and returned during the following week. *Training date TBD and instructional guides will be provided at that time.* 

## \*Audio-Visual Ministry

The Audio-Visual Ministry is now an essential part of our worship and communications. The AV team supports worship through the real-time management of the sound system and connects us to the wider community through livestreaming of services and special events. A level of comfort with audio technology and computers is desirable, and training is also provided. *Training date TBD*.

#### \*Eucharistic Ministers

Eucharistic Ministers are trained adults that assist the priests during services by serving wine during communion. This is a licensed ministry and training is provided by our clergy. Prayerful consideration before entering this ministry is encouraged. 8:15am EM's serve approximately once a month. 10:30am EM's serve approximately once every 4-6 weeks. *Training date TBD*.

#### \*Flower Guild

Members arrange the altar flowers and any other special flowers in the church for worship. Members generally arrange flowers on Saturday morning at approximately 9:00am for about an hour. On Sunday following the 10:30am service, a team re-arranges the altar flowers in small vases to be given to parishioners who are celebrating birthdays or anniversaries. Occasionally these small vases are taken to shut-ins or to hospitals. Anyone with an interest in flowers and arranging is encouraged to join this special ministry. Guild members work in teams and are usually assigned to one Sunday a month. NOTE: The Flower Delivery Team delivers flowers, not the Flower Guild. Please see the Flower Delivery entry under the Community Care heading for more information about that ministry.

#### \*Greeters

Our Greeters warmly welcome newcomers and parishioners to worship services and encourage newcomers and visitors to fill out visitor cards or sign the visitor book. After the service, they seek out and interact with newcomers welcoming them to our community. *Training will be on September 10 after the late service*.

## \*Intercessors

Intercessors offer the Prayers of the People during either the Holy Eucharist Rite I or Rite II service. Training and guidance are provided. Intercessors serve approximately every other month at both the early and late services. *Training will be September 17 after the late service*.

Lectors read the appointed lessons during worship services. At the 8:15am service, Lectors read all appointed lessons. At the 10:30am service, Lectors are appointed to read only one lesson. Special training and guidance are provided. Lectors serve approximately once every 8-12 weeks. *Training will be September 17 after the late service*.

## **\*Oblation Bearers**

"What is an oblation bearer?" you may ask. That is easy to answer. At the late service only, two oblation bearers bring forth the bread and wine to be consecrated for Holy Eucharist. Adults, families, and older children (with a parent) are encouraged to be a part of this ministry. If you are interested, please sign up during the Ministry Fair. There is no training, other than the first time you may be paired with a current oblation bearer.

We will kick off in September with four weeks on Hospitality facilitated by Mother Elizabeth and the Reverend Mary Davis (September 10, 17, 24, and October 1). As this community embarks on a Capital Campaign and dreams with the Holy Spirit about how we are called to steward our resources and physical spaces - what do Scripture and our Tradition say about how we are to welcome and show care to one another? And how might that help us dream about our spaces and our giving?

And then join us on Sundays, October 15, 22, 29, and November 12, as Mother Elizabeth, Father Cal, and others facilitate "Our Money Story: Remember - Release - Reimagine - Restore." Stewardship Season and the Capital Campaign offer us an opportunity "to discover and tell our money stories in light of God's money story of liberation and justice." This will be an intergenerational offering; our children and youth will also follow this series which "encourages us to transform our stewardship practices

into more full expressions of who we are and what we believe. . . Money and possessions are one of the most common topics in scripture, and Jesus talked about money more than faith and prayer. Our money story, therefore, is a spiritual story."



Unlike any other shelter in Knoxville, Family Promise assists whole families, including those with single fathers, those with boys more than 12 years old, or those with both parents and their children.

At Good Sam, we host up to four families overnight for one week each quarter of the year, providing the families dinner and accommodations. Good Sam volunteers set up the rooms for our guests, prepare and serve the dinner, spend the night, and clean up the rooms at the end of the week, including laundering the bed linens. In addition, we purchase needed supplies and gift cards for the families. Our next Family Promise Week is October 1-8. Please consider helping with this ministry when online sign-up sheet comes out. The Justice Knox mission is to understand problems facing the Knoxville community through person-to-person conversation, and to grow those conversations into prioritized, research-based action items. These action items are targeted and have a real impact on the lives of underserved—or not before heard—community members.
